



ABOUT THE NATIONAL YOUTH AWARDS


The National Youth Awards was established to commemorate the celebration of International Youth Day with the aim of bringing recognition to youth excellence.

The first of her produce was used to help feed her family and she donated the surplus to neighbours and persons in need. Danae was showcased in various T.V. interviews including the Best Village Unit, launch of the Grow It Yourself Challenge.



IHSAAN SOOBRATTEE

Ihsaan Soobrattee has always been fascinated with nature, helping care for vegetable crops at home. He used egg shells and vegetable peelings as compost and planted tomato plants in old paint containers. In April 2022, he was introduced to the SURE Foundation and their activities to promote agriculture among kids. In June, he was encouraged to join IKAW – Increase Kids to Agro World, another NGO, striving to teach and encourage kids in agriculture. His interest has widened and he talks about farming as a possible career.



JORDAN ALI

Jordan Ali is an influencer who has inspired his fellow students to become more actively involved in agriculture. He led a team to victory in the recent Prime Minister's Best Village Award: Medium Category (Grow It Yourself) 2022. He also led his classmates to establish a Breadfruit Tree Forest at School, and successfully completed his Level 1 Caribbean Vocational Qualification in Tree Crop Farming. His humble leadership style is admirable, as he has moved his class to enter the Caribbean Vocational Qualifications Level II course of studies, in Rabbit Rearing.

Elon Robinson is the CEO of Better-Grow HydroFarm, who has made significant strides, as he began with 1000 plants and has now expanded to 8000+ plants. His goal is to become one of the best farmers, not only in T&T, but in the Caribbean. Along with his work in the community, he also spreads a consistent message on social media to inspire other young people to follow their dreams and work hard to create their own paths in agriculture.



JODY WHITE

Jody White is the worldwide inventor of making macaroni from cassava and is the largest exporter of sweet potato and cassava products in Trinidad and Tobago. He has had 8 #1 products on amazon, all based with sweet potatoes and cassava. He serves as a mentor to many upcoming agro processors and exporters.



RONALD CHAN

Ronald Chan grew up on a poultry and agriculture farm in Valencia, Trinidad. Ronald continues to contribute to the agricultural industry through the design and implementation of projects which favor agriculture and entrepreneurship.



CHAMPION ARTS AND CULTURE AWARD (10-17)

ALYSSA JOSEPH

Alyssa Joseph recently won Junior Grand Vocalist and Junior Grand Champion at the World Championships of Performing Arts (WCOPA) in Los Angeles on July 30, 2022, receiving 2 trophies, 8 medals and one plaque. Alyssa is a singer, songwriter, artist, dancer, influencer, performer and international radio co-host on the Isaac 98.1F.M tweens program. She has 10 original songs with very positive, meaningful messages.



DANIEL RAJKUMAR

Daniel Rajkumar began Art at the age of 3 years, expressing his love for Trinidad and Tobago's culture by capturing the flora, fauna and people through his paintings. At age 12, his portraits are of a professional standard, as he exhibited ten times at the Rotunda Gallery and once at both the Art Society of Trinidad and Tobago and the Fine Arts Market. He spends time perfecting his Art, hoping to inspire people.



IHOUMA STRAUGHN GEORGE

Ihouma George is a 14-year-old Singer/Songwriter and recording Artiste from the beautiful village of Mt. Pleasant, Tobago. A student of the Mason Hall Government Secondary School and a Child Rights Ambassador for Trinidad and Tobago, Ihouma is a soulful performer who uses her voice to bring awareness to issues affecting youth. To date, Ihouma has recorded eleven (11) songs, some featuring artistes from around the world.



CHAMPION ARTS AND CULTURE AWARD (18-35)

A young person who excels in arts and culture. This can include performing arts (song, dance, monologue, drama, spoken word, music, entertainment and art and craft).



ANA LEESA RAMNARINE

Popularly known as DJ Ana, Ms. Ramnarine has been a pioneer of our culture taking our local music, customs and culture to the people of the world. During the pandemic, she freely entertained thousands of people on her live videos, teaching many people about the existence of Trinidad and Tobago. Her visual mixtape series showcases beautiful and historic places in Trinidad and Tobago and has gained millions of views on YouTube!



JOSHUA REGRELLO

Joshua Regrello is a young, dynamic 'musical maverick' in the steelpan world of Trinidad and Tobago and is fast becoming the most sought-after pannist in the Caribbean. His unique approach to the performance on the National instrument, has infused a new wave of interest and appreciation for the pan among the younger generations. He has released, on the Digicel 'D Music App' and on Youtube, compilations of popular songs on the steelpan.



KEMI IBLE

Kemi Ible is a multi-skilled creative, who has a Bachelor's Degree in Music from the University of the West Indies and is currently pursuing a Master's in Education. As a member of Nutrien Silver Stars, she has arranged for their stage-side band. She has tutored pan for the youth band, North Coast Pan Serenaders, and has also been the main Musical Arranger for the Patrons of the Arts Steel Band Camp, held at Queen's Hall.



CHAMPION CREATIVITY IN TECHNOLOGICAL INNOVATION AWARD (18-35)

A young person who has achieved excellence in ICT or technology, including invented or created an app, designed an element, or invented an object that has improved, positively changed or impacted on the lives of T&T citizens.



JUDE MARK

In January 2020, due to the pandemic, Jude Mark's global fashion brand launch was cancelled. He immediately pivoted and began the design of a Wearable Technology device; a "Personal Air Filtration Tech Helmet." This device was innovated to fight not just against airborne viruses but also air pollution, which happens to kill over 7 million persons each year. He now has an Advisory Board of some of Silicon Valley's most respected names in Tech.



ROMARIO PATRICE

As a young film director/editor/producer and actor from Moruga, Trinidad & Tobago, Romario Patrice began his career at a young age, doing short YouTube videos and transitioned into film-making at a later age. Currently at 25 years, his goal is to keep pushing forward to reach the pinnacle of his career, to work with a big budget film studio while also promoting his community, culture and the traditions of Trinidad and Tobago.



SHIVAM TEELUCKSINGH

Since 2019, Shivam Teelucksingh has helped people in the field of technology. He goes around the country doing free repairs for students and now offers free courses for people in need. He also promotes digital transformation and education, as best as he can! He was awarded an Angostura Champion Award in 2020 and is presently in the Internet Society's IGF 2022 Youth Ambassador Program Finals.

Arisa Rajan is a young lady who has endured a plethora of issues that have forged her into a daring and adventurous gem, despite her petit stature and depth of challenges faced. Her musical talent has shone through with multiple Awards and her passion as a Scout has brought exemplary recognition.



DYLAN SAMPSON

Dylan Sampson was only 8 years old when an AVM (Arteriovenous Malformation) ruptured, causing severe trauma and bleeding in the left side of his brain. Having to learn to write with his other hand, endure a long period of therapy and medical attention, he has gone on to achieve, with exemption, in his scholastic and other ventures, including the steelpan.



SIDARA AKALLOO

The name Sidara Akalloo is synonymous with resilience as the entire nation of Trinidad and Tobago has been privy to her strength, determination and courage to persevere against all odds. This is a success story that many, both young and old have been inspired by, as depite being diagnosed with Acute Lylphoblastic Leukemia at age 10, she persevered and succeeded, "attending classes with a needle in her chest and chemotherapy pumping through her veins."



CHAMPION DOUBLE CHACONIA AWARD YOUTHFUL RESILIENCE (18-35)

A young person who, in the face of exceptional challenges (family circumstances, geographical location, mental and physical health), continues to make an important contribution to society or is an inspirational role model to others.



AKILAH HUGHES-PANTIN

Akilah Hughes-Pantin began a Degree in Medicine at UWI St. Augustine in 2007 but was unable to complete the Programme, due to traumatic distress caused by an accident. In 2012, she started her entrepreneurship journey with agri-businesses in Jamaica. She returned to Trinidad and continued her education, while seeking professional help for mental health issues. She enrolled in the DLAB GLOBAL offered by the Organization of American States (OAS) and an MA in Creative Design Entrepreneurship Degree at UWI. She will be awarded her Masters with Distinctions in October 2022.



TAARIOKA KELLY

Despite struggling with depression, Taariqka Kelly has been a beacon of light in her community. In the year 2020, Taariqka experienced one of the most horrific series of events anyone can imagine. Despite this, she continues to be heavily involved in community work and charity drives, in her community.



TIAJUANA HERNANDEZ

Tiajuana Hernandez is a musician, teacher and entrepreneur battling with Systemic Lupus Erythematosus. Despite financial struggles, rough environmental conditions and her autoimmune illness, Tiajuana has persevered and completed her Music Degree at the University of the West Indies among other successes. As a youth ambassador for the Voice of Lupus Foundation, her resilience continues to be an inspiration to many.



CHAMPION ENTREPRENEURSHIP AWARD (10-17)

A young person who has generated or created a business idea and established a business that generates income and/or creativity in the field of business.



ERYN BRATHWAITE

Eryn Brathwaite, at age 10 years, is an accomplished young entrepreneur. Whilst maintaining good academic grades, she conducts research on appropriate ingredients for her soaps, to ensure compatibility to persons with sensitive skins. With support and encouragement, Eryn will be a valuable asset in the small business/ manufacturing sector of Trinidad and Tobago.



JAFARI GORDON

Jafari Gordon is a remarkable young man and an extraordinary young entrepreneur. His experience and progress working in ICT ventures at Pennacool and Cariri has propelled him to assist on building the Jelani Ubi website, which is an online store selling dried marinates that focuses on local country food and flavours.



ROCHELLE PERSAD

Rochelle Persad is the entrepreneur/owner of Rochelle's Sweet Treats. Rochelle's Down syndrome makes her an avid self-advocate and motivational speaker. She has participated in TV interviews, Down Syndrome Family Network Conference 2022 and is an awardee in Appreciation and Recognition for her Exceptional Achievements.



CHAMPION ENTREPRENEURSHIP AWARD (18-35)

A young person who has generated or created a business idea and established a business that generates income and/or creativity in the field of business.



ANNEILA DAVIS

Annelia Davis is the CEO of Annelia's Healthy Living, located in Goodwood, Tobago. She was exposed to Agriculture at a tender age which led to her pursuing a BSc in Food Science and Technology at UTT. In 2019, Annelia's final year project was selected for the 55th Annual CFCS. She was astonished and driven by this accomplishment, which led her to opening her own agro-business.



CHRISTIAN WARD

Christian Ward's experience in hospitality inspired him to offer consultancy services for struggling hospitality businesses, through his company 'TT Hotels and Guest House Management'. Trading as Capital Hotel and Guest House Management", he later rebranded as Kadoa Resorts and Consultancy. His business is internationally accredited by FIB USA and received the "Award of Excellence". Kadoa's first contract is with "The Colibri Inns" in Tobago.



MATTHAUS WILFORD

Matthaus Wilford is a 2018 graduate Doctor, who despite unemployment challenges, identified the need for a Dialysis Centre in South Trinidad. In spite of his personal hurdles, he opened Reno Pure Dialysis Centre, which provides high-level care and comprehensive treatment for CKD patients at an affordable cost. Presently Mr. Wilford's endeavour is to open another centre in Edinburg 500, Chaguanas.

SAMAIYA SANCHEZ

With disdain for plastic refuse and its damaging effects on our environment, seventeen (17) year old Samaiya Sanchez vigorously initiated projects in her community, school, and youth group partnering with some exceptional non-profit organisations, impacting beneficial shifts in eco-friendly exercises. Samaiya launched a project that resulted in the Youth Club collecting over Eleven Thousand (11 000) plastic bottles, contributing to the invention of practical items, and educating youths about better choices with biodegradable alternatives. She directed a beach clean-up exercise which helped clear debris to welcome the nesting sea turtles.

KATRINA KHAN-ROBERTS

Katrina Khan-Roberts has been an environmental advocate since childhood. She is knowledgeable and aware of the vulnerabilities and risks associated with living on a Small Island Developing State. She leads by example, living and advocating for sustainability in the country. She speaks and educates on recycling and waste management, water resources and everything in between.

Khadija Stewart is an enthusiastic climate specialist with a passion for inspiring behaviour change through knowledge sharing and innovative story-telling. Khadija has represented Trinidad and Tobago at numerous International events, including lending her voice, ideas, talents and stories to several initiatives worldwide with Peace Boat, Global Water Partnership, the World Youth Parliament for Water, Caribbean Climate Justice, UNESCO Caribbean, IOC-UNESCO, UNDESA and UNFCCC all focused on Sustainable Development Goals 6, 13, and 14.

The idea to start a student-centered blended learning school developed while Mr. Holder was pursuing his Post Graduate Diploma in Instructional Design and Technology in 2017, developing the institution in 2018, providing both face to face and online classes inclusive of morning, evening, and night schedules for learners of all needs. Since then, and with students across the English speaking Caribbean, he has successfully opened physical schools in Grenada and St Lucia, with further expansion on the horizon.



DR. MIA GOMANDY BENJAMIN

Dr. Mia Gormandy-Benjamin is an Assistant Professor of Music (Steelpan) at the University of Trinidad and Tobago (UTT) as well as the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of PanNotation. She is also the Artistic Director for the world-renowned Trinidad All Stars Steel Orchestra and serves as conductor for the Orquesta Nacional de Parang de Trinidad y Tobago, the recently formed national parang orchestra. She possesses a Bachelor of Music degree (2009), a Master of Music degree (2011) in steelpan performance from Northern Illinois University (NIU). She then received a second Master of Music degree (2013) and a Doctor of Philosophy degree (2017) in ethnomusicology from Florida State University (FSU).

OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH

YOUTH AGRICULTURAL HOMESTEAD PROGRAMME



YAHP offers young nationals between 18 and 35 years, an opportunity to become '21st century agri-entrepreneurs.' Selected applicants will enroll in a full time training programme through the University of Trinidad and Tobago, Centeno, and will be awarded a Certificate of Agriculture and Agro-Processing. In the second year, participants' grades and attendance would determine if they qualify to receive a grant, starter homes and sheds to pursue their agri-business ventures.

NATIONAL LEADERSHIP TRAINING PROGRAMME

The National Leadership Training Programme (NLTP) is an initiative delivered in conjunction with the University of the West Indies, St. Augustine. The target audience for this initiative is youths 16 to 35 years old from youth-led/youth serving groups and those interested in youth work. The NLTP seeks to prepare and equip with leadership and enhanced decision-making skills for the betterment of society.

YOUTH AGRICULTURAL SHADE HOUSE PROJECT

Shade House is a youth-focused agricultural project designed to equip young persons ages 16 to 35 with the knowledge of Shade House Farming - intensive farming on small portions of land to produce high-value, short-term crops. This project, geared to increasing youth engagement in transforming the local agricultural sector, will also encourage participants to develop agriculture co-operatives.
